They will learn about the importance of resilience in regards to mental health and how the media and social media can have an impact on our mental health. Students will learn about substance misuse and the laws regarding substance misuse as well as where to get help and what a support plan may involve. Students will learn about how people can be groomed and exploited with a focus around child criminal exploitation, knife crime and radicalisation. Students will also learn about female genital mutilation, breast ironing and honour based abuse. Students will explore what it is to be a good citizen who contributes to society and about first aid which means they can contribute to society in emergency situations.
