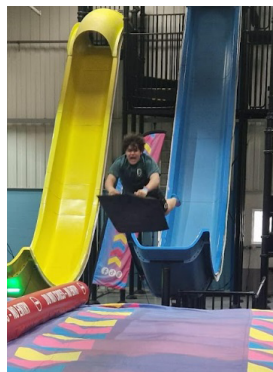

Big ideas	Lessons:	Curriculum summary
Relationships	1. My Relationships - Peers	Students will learn about risky relationships with peers including gangs, knife crime and anti-social behaviour. They will learn about healthy relationships and connections including love. They will explore how love is portrayed in the media and in society and about loss. Students will learn about the different stages of a relationship and how to end romantic relationships. Students will learn about sexuality, gender and gender stereotypes. They will learn about how change can affect you physically and emotionally and how you can manage change in your life.
