Dear Blaise families,

We are writing to celebrate how well Year 10 students have done in their previous unit assessments and to explain some changes in the lead up to the Unit 2 Year 10 assessments that will take place from **Monday 9th March to Friday 20th March**.

An important part of preparing for assessments is revision. In the last assessment window all Y10 students were asked to complete three types of revision: self-quizzing, Sparx and Assessment Manifest tasks. Assessment Manifest tasks were specific revision tasks designed by class teachers to support students with their assessments. Students used these effectively to prepare for the assessments and we can see the impact of this in their results. Completing these assessment manifest tasks is key to student success in the exams but also for building the revision habits needed to achieve the best outcomes later in life.

We know long-lasting habits are built through rewards, consequences and a sense of success. To support students to build the habit of effective revision we will:

- Make assessment manifest tasks **compulsory for all students**
- **Check assessment manifest tasks** alongside other homework each day in the lead up to and during assessments
- Issue a **same day 20 minute detention** if students do not complete their assessment manifest tasks
- Final Ascent will be open to Year 10 students to complete work after school on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays from Monday 9th February until 20th March.
- Provide prizes for high quality completion such as green points, flashcards and book vouchers.
- Celebrate high quality completion in assemblies

Students will be given their Assessment Manifest on **Friday 6th February**, the first task is due on Tuesday 10th of February and all tasks will be completed by the 20th March. This means the Assessment Manifest tasks will run for five weeks in total, three in advance of the assessments and two during.

Students will complete one revision task each evening and this will take up to 30 minutes to complete. They will find English, Maths and Science revision tasks in the Core Assessment Manifest. They will find the revision tasks for their other subjects in the Options Assessment Manifest. These tasks will give students the opportunity to rehearse knowledge, think deeply and apply knowledge. Students will self-mark each task in green pen using their knowledge organiser or the appendix. They will complete revision tasks for all of their subjects, even if they don't have an assessment for this unit, as these tasks will help them review core knowledge.

Your child completing these revision tasks will help unlock success in their current exams, but it will also build the resilient revision habits your child needs to achieve their best outcomes in Year 11 and beyond. The role that families play in forming these habits is vital, and we appreciate your continued support in helping your child reach the top of their own personal mountain.
