Dear Parents / Carers,

Happy Friday everyone and welcome back to the second half term of the year at Blaise High School!

I hope you all had a fantastic half term break and were able to rest and spend time together as a family. We've had a busy first week back at Blaise including welcoming visitors to our school. Sir John Hunt is a school in Plymouth that is joining Greenshaw Learning Trust. The staff from Sir John Hunt were really impressed by Blaise and in particular commented on how kind and polite our students were towards them. Next week, we are having a big push to improve punctuality to lessons.
